Subject: Resettlement of IDPs in December – Reg.

Reference: Memorandums submitted regarding "*request to ensure the fulfillment of the promised December resettlement and restore normalcy and dignity to the displaced families*" - from 1st December 2025 to 31st December 2025.


Sir,

This is with reference to the memorandums submitted by the Joint Representatives of IDPs, endorsed by the Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity (COCOMI), to the Hon'ble Governor of Manipur and the Chief Secretary, Government of Manipur, on the subject cited above. It may be noted that the State Government has apprised to the IDPs/ COCOMI from time to time through meetings, media and through Press Releases (latest press released dated 30th December 2025 enclosed).

2. The State Government reiterates that the rehabilitation and resettlement of Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) remains the highest humanitarian priority. It is clarified that resettlement is necessarily contingent upon multiple critical factors such as security situation, site readiness, land availability, fund flow, climatic conditions and livelihood feasibility. Accordingly, the process is being implemented in a phased, dynamic and pragmatic manner rather than as a rigid, one-time, deadline-driven exercise.

Housing and Resettlement Planning:

3. While the initial efforts were directed towards emergency shelter and temporary accommodation, it was followed by systematic planning for permanent housing solutions for the IDPs. A comprehensive resettlement plan for resettlement of about 60,000 IDPs is in place, under various government schemes.



4. It is reiterated that the primary objective has been to gradually rehabilitate IDPs out of relief camps, restore stable living conditions, and enable resumption of livelihoods, education and normal community life. The rehabilitation planned is not mere relocation of the IDPs from one location to another, rather a holistic movement of the IDPs with focus on livelihood, education and overall wellness of the IDPs.

Phased Resettlement Strategy:

5. The Government has initiated phased resettlement under the Resettlement and Rehabilitation Package of ₹523 crore, as announced in the Manipur Budget 2025-26. The strategy is structured into three sequential phases:

- (i) **Phase I:** Resettlement of families whose houses have been partially damaged.
- (ii) **Phase II:** Resettlement of families provided housing under the Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana–Gramin (PMAY-G) (Special Package) within their respective districts.
- (iii) **Phase III:** Resettlement of families requiring inter-district relocation between Valley and Hill districts, involving enhanced coordination, infrastructure development and security arrangements.

Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) and Support Measures:

6. With the support of the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, the State Government has continuously provided essential support to IDPs residing in relief camps. Furthermore, from 1st November, 2025, the State Government has transitioned to the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system for the IDPs. In addition, IDPs are being supported through the following:

- (i) Healthcare services and medical assistance.
- (ii) Educational facilities for children.
- (iii) Employment opportunities under rural employment guarantee schemes.
- (iv) Livelihood support through Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and other income-generation initiatives.

Security Arrangements:

7. In order to ensure safe rehabilitation, comprehensive security assessments are being conducted at all proposed resettlement sites. Joint planning is undertaken by Deputy Commissioners, security forces and local stakeholders and construction of security barracks and deployment infrastructure is also being integrated with housing development. It may be noted that resettlement is taken up only where long-term safety and stability can be reasonably ensured.

Continuous Engagement and Monitoring:


8. IDP resettlement is being treated as a continuous humanitarian mission and not as a one-time administrative exercise. Regular interaction with community representatives is

being maintained to address grievances and strengthen mutual trust. Time-bound implementation remains a core priority, with sustained efforts to minimize hardship and restore dignity.

9. It is reiterated that the State Government assures that all concerns raised are being addressed with utmost seriousness, sensitivity and urgency. The resettlement process is already underway with the cooperation of the IDPs and other stakeholders which shall continue to be strengthened through sustained financial support, robust security planning and close community participation until every displaced family is rehabilitated in a safe, secure and dignified manner.
